


Since the Georgia State Legislature and then Gov. Sonny Perdue passed a package of tax incentives for the film, television, and media industries in 2008, the industry has been a boom for the state economy. The Atlanta Business Chronicle reported in August of 2018 that "The industry is responsible for about 92,100 jobs and \$4.6 billion in wages, directly employing around 28,700 Georgians."

In addition to the film and television industry, Georgia's *creative industries* as a whole contributed an estimated 62.5 BILLION dollars in economic impact to the state of Georgia. This number pushed the agriculture industry out of the top spot for the first time in our state's history and made *creative industries* Georgia's new #1 cash crop. Creative industries include the film and television industry along with digital entertainment and communication, music, and arts and culture.

The growth of creative industries in our state, as well as globally, presents Georgia's public schools and students with a unique opportunity to take advantage of the career opportunities and business development happening in our state.

The Georgia Department of Education has been working over the last several years to develop new courses and performance standards that address these rapidly growing and emerging industries in our state. Statewide adoption of these new standards will begin in the 2019-2020 academic year.
